Net Zero/Solara Tax Cert: Motion made by Ms. Dowse, seconded by Mr. Thompson, WHEREAS, the Board of Education previously authorized intervention in a legal action titled. In The Matter of the Application of Net Zero Village, LLC and Solara One, LLC v. Assessor of the Town of Rotterdam, the Board of Assessment Review of the Town of Rotterdam, and the Town of Rotterdam, New York (Index No. 2020-0937 & 2021-1549) regarding issues related to the tax assessments of the Net Zero Village, LLC and Solara One, LLC ("Net Zero/Solara") property identified as Tax Map No. 57.-3-2.11 and 48.9-2-10.1; and, WHEREAS, the parties have reached settlement under which the assessed value of 57-.3-2.11 shall be set at Eleven Million One-Hundred Fifty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$11,154,000.00) and the assessed value of 48.9-2-10.1 shall be set at Eight Million Four-Hundred Forty-Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,448,000.00); and WHEREAS, Real Property Tax Law § 727 applies to this settlement; and, WHEREAS, the Superintendent of Schools and Board Counsel recommend acceptance of this settlement. I'T IS HEREBY RESOLVED THAT, the above referenced actions be settled and discontinued for the recommended terms of settlement and that any refunds owed shall be paid from the Tax Cert Reserve Fund to the extent possible; and, IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, the Superintendent of Schools, Board President, and Board Counsel are authorized to execute any documents necessary to settle and discontinue the above referenced action.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED by and between the Schalmont Central School District, 4 Sabre Drive, Schencctady, New York 12306, and the Board of Cooperative Educational Services of Albany-Schoharie-Schencctady-Saratoga Counties with offices at 900 Watervliet-Shaker Road, Albany, New York 12205 (BOCES) as follows:

- 1. PREMISES. The District hereby leases to BOCES certain Distance Learning classroom(s). Each classroom covered by this lease agreement shall comply with the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education.
- 2. <u>TERM.</u> The term of this lease agreement shall be for a period of one year commencing on July 1, 2021 and ending June 30, 2022.
- 3. <u>RENT</u>. BOCES shall pay to the District an annual rent of \$1,000 per classroom for a total of \$1,000. Annual rental payments shall be payable before June 30 each year of this lease.
- 4. MAINTENANCE OF CLASSROOM LOCATION. It is the hope and expectation of both parties that each classroom provided for herein will remain at one location for the duration of the term and any renewal. Moving of a classroom to another location in the same building or relocating the classroom in another school building may only take place in the event of extraordinary and unforeseen circumstances (e.g., fire, asbestos removal, major district reorganization). The District shall give written notice to BOCES of its reasons for proposing to move or relocate a classroom as soon as possible after the occurrence of the extraordinary circumstance.
- 5. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH REGULATIONS</u>. The Lessor will obtain a certificate of occupancy from the appropriate authorities and lessor covenants that it will be in continuing compliance with all required local, State Education Department, Federal and State regulations.
- 6. <u>APPROVAL BY COMMISSIONER</u>. The terms of this lease and any modifications shall not become effective until approved by the Commissioner of Education.


WHEREAS, the attached school district listing has explored and supported the establishment of a municipal cooperative purchasing group; and
